Terms of Reference

Context

The Carter Center partners with governments, civil society, and international and regional bodies to enhance governance and transform lives through a meaningful right of access to information and justice for women. Women in Bangladesh face disproportionate challenges in exercising the fundamental right of access to information, which hinders economic empowerment and the promotion and protection of other human rights. Although the Bangladesh Right to Information (RTI) Act went into effect in 2009, the benefits of meaningful access to information for women have not fully been realized.

To address these challenges, the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) awarded funding to The Carter Center in 2023 to support the Advancing Women's Right of Access to Information (AWRTI) in Bangladesh Activity (the Project) in target districts. Under this project, the Center is working to implement three mutually reinforcing objectives, with a focus on assisting
